




How to import GPS Point of Interest (POI) into Google Maps

1. Sign in to Google at Google.com




Create account if needed.

In this presentation Info@FlagpolePhotographers.com is the Google account being used.

Note: you **do not need** to use a Gmail email account for your Google account




2. Click on the **Apps** icon (9 dot grid)

Google Maps app




3. Click on the Maps icon




Open Google Maps




4. Open Google Maps menu (3 horizontal bars)





5. Open **Your places** custom maps area




6. Click on **Maps**, then **CREATE MAP**



7. Click on **Untitled map** to rename it



8. Import a Locations file that you downloaded



9. Drag & Drop a Locations csv file to start import

10. Click **Continue** for default Longitude & Latitude

Choose columns to position your placemarks


Select the columns from your file that tell us where to put placemarks on the map, such as addresses or latitude-longitude pairs. All columns will be imported.

Pick a column to use as the title for the placemarks, such as the name of the location or person.







11. Celebrate, your first Locations are imported!




12. Make it better by adding Acadia - Food.csv




Add a layer and repeat the import process with a new Locations CSV



13. Now in Acadia you have location and food ideas



14. Zoom and click any location to get details!



Browse the locations and learn a lot more about where to take photos.

All of the Google map functionality is available like getting directions. You can also share this map with anybody using their email address



Using Location maps on phone with **Google Maps**


Start Google Maps on your phone.

It knows where you are.


Now to tell it where you want to go.




1. Open Google Maps **menu** (3 horizontal bars)




2. Click on **Your places**




3. Click on **MAPS**, then the map you create

4. All of the locations (POIs) are displayed




